A fun, full few weeks...



Since our last update, it's been a really fun and busy few weeks for us as a family—lots of time with friends, getting out and about, and making the most of the better weather. Isla in particular has loved being outside more.

One standout moment was her first bike ride... which, honestly, took two hours to get her into the seat 😊. In the end, a dandelion did the trick and sealed the deal. But once she was in, she absolutely loved it—quiet the whole way round the park for 45 minutes! It felt like a real win. As always with MHOP, we've been really enjoying gathering in praise and prayer.

There's something so special about those times—however small the group (often just 5-10 of us), there's a real sense that God is with us, meeting us, and fuelling what we're doing together.

We recently had a slightly bigger

gathering where we shared a Seder-style meal together, reflecting on the Passover story. We sang, read Scripture, and shared different elements like herbs, matzah and juice to remember different parts of the story. It was a

really meaningful evening.

It's also a bit of a bittersweet moment as Cristina, our other staff member, comes to the end of her year with us. We're so grateful for the time she's given—she's brought real strength to the team and carries such a genuine heart for prayer and community. We're really hoping this isn't the end and that she might be able to come back longer-term.

Later this month, some of the team will be heading to Chester for a 36-hour worship and prayer gathering with some close friends who lead a house of prayer there and are connected into a wider UK network. We're really looking forward to that.

Many of you will remember that the last couple of months have felt like a significant time of God speaking to us—through Scripture, dreams, and conversations. That's continued, which has surprised us. We're sensing God highlight themes and direction for this next season, and we're trying to listen carefully and discern what He's asking of us. We'd really value your prayers in this—it feels like an important time.

Table

Table continues to be such an encouraging part of what we're doing. We're really grateful for the doors God is opening with churches across the UK and Ireland, and for the chance to serve local Churches by creating spaces where young adults—many of whom wouldn't normally walk into a church—can find community, ask questions, and explore faith.

In Leeds, a climbing group the team started has been going really well. Around 10 people gathered last week, and it's becoming a great space for friendships and conversations about life and faith. Please do pray for Phil as he leads that—he's doing a brilliant job hosting with real warmth and generosity.

Newcastle continues to surprise us. The online group is now close to 1,500 people, which is kind of wild. Events are filling up quickly, with waiting lists, and new people are joining almost every day. Michael, Johnny and the team are doing such a great job building something really welcoming and accessible. It's been especially encouraging to see a small group of Hindus starting to explore faith in Jesus and even coming along to church.

We're also in conversations about developing longer-term partnerships with churches in Belfast, Bristol and Cardiff. These are relationships that have been growing over time, and as we look to formalise things a bit more, we'd really value prayer—that Table in these cities would be fruitful, and that many young adults would come to know Jesus, find community, and step into their purpose.

The second Table event in Dublin is happening this week, with some new hosts involved and a good level of interest. We're praying that as people gather, the Holy Spirit really meets with them, that meaningful friendships begin, and that those who are spiritually curious feel at home.
